Brief description of the organization

Domari Society of Gypsies in Jerusalem was founded in the year 2000 by Amoun Sleem. Ms. Sleem, a Dom herself, experienced first-hand the severe discrimination, cultural marginalization, poverty and adult illiteracy among the society. Her familiarity with the needs of this group of people was the impetus for her dream of founding the Domari Society.

She started the organization out of her own home where it functioned for it's first five years of existence. In 2005, the community center, located in Shu'afat of East Jerusalem, was opened, and it is here that the organization still resides.

The center is a warm and welcoming place and offers the members of the Dom community a secure space to gather and receive practical support and educational resources. The center provides afterschool tutoring, job skills training, literacy courses, humanitarian aid, and programs that foster cultural pride.

The Domari Center projects in 2018

Pedagogy Sessions for the baby care

Project Day: Oct. 17th 2018 Donors: Kinderpostzegels

Goals

- To increase the awareness of Dom women to the health of their family and children
- To improve the child care environment of Dom and raise babies in comfortableness
- To improve the status of Dom women within their families and their society

Objectives

- To provide the knowledge of infant care to the Dom women with professional advises
- To increase confidence of Dom mothers in their baby care skills and give them moral or psychological support

Implemented activities

The lecture is on October 17th for three hours (10:00-13:00). The teacher was Janny Sjaak from kinderpostzegels, who is an educational specialist. She let Dom mothers talk about the home environment using some pictures on cards. Then show two thought-provoking videos. Mothers got professional advises about their home environment and infant care skills.

Achievements

The lecture provide the Dom mothers the opportunity to think about their home environment for their babies. It was good opportunity for Dom mothers. In addition, talking about their own problems and opinions with other Dom mothers was also important for themselves. It relieved their stress and provided psychological care. Besides, they got professional advises about their home environment and infant care skills. The lecture increased the self-confidence of the participants. It will improve the status of Dom women within their families and their society.

This time they learned about baby care. The teacher recommended that they continue learning about their home environment for their children, and they should have the lecture about the care for teenager.





Educational Program

Project duration: January 2018 - December 2018

Goal

- To raise the educational level of Dom children
- To increase the respect of their parents for their children's education
- To give the children a broader choice of future works

Objectives

- *To improve students' results*We try to improve our students' results by offering lessons and assistance with homework or study for exams.
- To Stop the children dropping out the school and encourage them to go into higher education.
 Dom children have an exceptionally high dropout rate due to the pressures of discrimination and poverty.
 We support their study so that they can do well at the school.
 Furthermore, we help them the study to enter the higher education.
- To increase the involvement of the families in the education process
 The Domari family tend to think that helping the house work
 is more important for the children than their study.
 We hope to change the thinking. The family can have
 a significant impact on the child's desire to continue
 learning through this program. The involvement of
 the parents facilitates the cooperation between the center,
 the school and the families and allows us to do
 the best possible for the children's progress.
- To raise the self-confidence of cultural identity

 The younger Dom generation has become less interested in the ancient traditions and culture of the Domari people, preferring rather to assimilate into the neighboring Arab communities. This self-imposed assimilation can be attributed to the discrimination and marginalization that the Dom people face. As a result, there are economic and social limitations that come from being identified and recognized as Dom. These limitations are both internally and externally imposed. We believe educating the younger generations will start to break down these limiting barriers.

Implemented activities

The center provided three lessons every week on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, in Arabic, English and Mathematics. In this year, 15 students (8 girls, 7 boys, 6-15 years old) participated in the program. We try to focus predominantly on the development of girls,

because they are treated unequally and are disadvantaged within the Domari community. There are two teachers (Mustafa Ibrahim and Muneera Joulani) to teach them.

In addition, we open the rooms almost every day in the whole year of 2018 so that children come to do their homework, study for exams, ask teachers about their studies. We provided meals to both students and teachers, and covered the bus transportation fees. In addition, we provided the students with necessary school supplies at the beginning of the school year.


Achievements

Children come to the center in order to study almost every day. It's very good to make it daily routine in order to get good grades in their school. There is no student dropped out the school. They all go to the school almost every day without big problems. 4 students entered to high school from junior high school.

Implemented activities

The center provided a lesson every week. 7 students (4 boys, 3 girls) attend the class generally. The teacher is *Wisaam Murad* from *Sabreen* which is an association for artistic development of music.

Achievements

The class just started August of this year, but Children enjoyed the class and now they acquired some skills of Drum. The class will continue the next year so that the children will acquire more advanced skill.
